Your bin will be delivered between November 29th and December 10th. All your recycling material will now be put into the recycling cart. Be sure to read the materials that accompany the cart as there is a reward system for recycling and your points can be redeemed at numerous stores.

The old cart is now yours to keep. The city will not pick it up when they deliver your cart. If you do not want the green bin you now have, you can put it into the new recycling bin on recycling day to be recycled, or you can take it to the Westpark Recycling Center.

Fire Protection Awareness

The Houston Fire Dept Chief spoke to us about basic tips since this was Fire Awareness month. He said most home fire-related casualties or injuries could have been avoided if the homeowner had functional fire detection systems. Many times they find fire detectors have bad batteries.

Burglaries

Burglaries of all types are on the rise in Central Division of Houston, as well as other downtown areas. HPD encourages everyone to practice extra caution and awareness in their neighborhoods. Promptly report any suspicious behavior.

HPD Success Story

Officer Wayne Pate and nine (9) other HPD Central Division officers were given a special recognition award by the HPD Chief of Police recently for successfully tracking and apprehending two (2) burglars responsible for approximately 150 burglaries in Central Division (most near the Neartown area). One burglar was apprehended on Monday, October 18th, and the second burglar was apprehended on Friday, October 22nd. Both had evidence on their persons validating their association to the crimes. One had a stolen wedding ring in his pocket!

TIP:

Officer Pate says it is VERY important to take pictures of your special belongings (such as jewelry). Also, record any serial numbers if possible. Such records immensely assist HPD in tracking stolen goods. All pawn shops are required to input serial numbers of items received into a central database. This is the first place HPD will check to determine if crooks have "pawned" stolen goods.

The following information is from The Citizens Guide to City of Houston Solid Waste Management Department Services:

Garbage Collection. Household garbage must be put inside the city-provided container which should be placed at the curb between 6:00 PM the day before and 7:00 AM on the scheduled collection day. The neighborhood does not look clean and tidy when our streets are full of garbage that will not be picked up until the next morning. Thanks for being a good neighbor!
