> Odd Numbered Addresses: Wednesday and Saturday Even Numbered Addresses: Thursday and Sunday



Long before VCCA began asking for Block Captain volunteers, Ann Ince had already organized her block of Huldy for social gatherings. Of course, these social gatherings also entailed watching out for each other.

To quote Ann, "This all started in 2006, when my husband Karl and I returned from living in Taiwan. Crostini's restaurant on Shepherd had a Happy Hour special on Thursdays: \$3 martinis plus free pizza. Our friends and fellow Huldy residents Bruce Perry, townhouse resident and Joe Hawkins, cottage resident, started joining us.

At some point in time, after Karl died in July 2007, Bruce and Joe suggested that the three of us continue the tradition. Off we went to Crostini's, which had gone out of business. We then started going to different places nearby and switched to Fridays. After a martini and snacks, they began coming back to my house to sit on the porch and drink wine. Gradually more neighbors began joining us - sometimes 2, or 3 or even 9. If the weather is cold and rainy we just stay at my house and order in Chinese.

Bruce and I drink vodka martinis and Joe drinks gin. So Bruce and I keep a bottle of "our" vodka in my freezer. It was the only thing in my freezer that came through Ike intact after 10 days without electricity".

Ann has been a resident since 1979. This has obviously been a great block to live on for a long time.

Dan, a 12-year resident of Vermont Commons and owner of a German shorthaired pointer, first took the dog to his veterinarian and had it checked for a radio-frequency identification (RFID) microchip. When there was not one, he walked the dog for hours each day, hoping its owner would spot it. When he was unable to locate its owner, he drove the dog 500 miles to Mississippi to his sister's house. His sister lives near a wooded area where the part setter and collie mix could run and enjoy the great outdoors.

Dan, who is a dog lover, became very attached to the dog, who was very happy-go-lucky and obedient. He said, "I am sad that I don't have the dog with me anymore, but happy to find it a good home." A great ending to what could have been a sad story.
