Not all of this information may be available to the resident reporting the crime, but communicating as much as possible will be beneficial to all Vermont Commons residents. We are planning to post this form on the VCCA website in a format that will enable the user to fill out the details and then forward the information to their block captain.

- Date of incident.
- Time of Incident.
- Address of incident.
- Method of entry.
- Was home locked?
- If there is a gate was it locked?
- List of items stolen.
- Damage to property.
- Was security system in use?
- Number of suspects.
- Description of suspect/s.

• Gender.

- Age.
- Physical description.
- Method of get-away.
- Description of vehicle.
- Type of vehicle.
- Was resident at home?
- If yes, was there a confrontation?
- Was there a weapon involved?
- Was a police report filed?
- If so, list the report number.

Citizen Patrol Training

If you are interested in volunteering as a Citizen Patroller, training will take place in July. Officer Pate requests that at least five residents register to attend the training before he will conduct the class. Call or email Jeanette Hix to let her know if you want to be trained as a Citizen Patroller. When at least five register for training, Officer Pate will schedule the date, time and place.

What is Citizen Patrol?

Citizen Patrol is a coordinated effort between the Houston Police Department (HPD) and VCCA to improve the safety of our neighborhood and reduce crime. The VCCA Citizen Patrol was initiated in May 2011 and has close to 40 volunteers who walk, bike or jog the streets to watch for suspicious people or events to report to the police.
