Change in Heavy Trash Collection Service

The Solid Waste Management Department announced that in a continuing effort to maximize cost savings, provide efficient service delivery and engage in proactive customer service, it is improving heavy trash and tree waste service. Effective November 1, 2012, the monthly heavy trash (tree waste/junk waste) pickup date for our neighborhood will change from the first Tuesday of the month to the first Wednesday of the month. Tree waste and junk waste collection will still occur in alternating months, odd-numbered months for tree waste and even-numbered months for junk waste. Please note that collection day schedules for other Solid Waste services such as garbage, yard waste trimmings and recycling collection WILL NOT change.
