### **Noisy Neighbors**

As we get ready to indulge in lots of good cheer and holiday festivities, it's worth a reminder to be a good neighbor when it comes to noise. The wonderful diversity of Vermont Commons residents - young and old, working people and retirees, students and shift workers - means that we have neighbors on different schedules. And with our homes close together, even sharing walls sometimes, a little noise can affect a lot of people nearby. So when you're having a late night party on your patio with friends, remember that you may have neighbors trying to get some sleep before the alarm goes off the next morning.

A few suggestions:

- If you're having a party that you know will go late, it's a courtesy to let nearby neighbors know ahead of time. Or better yet, ask them to join you! If you have music, step outside and check the volume levels. And watch the time loud music at 9:00 PM is much different than at 1:00 AM.
- Be flexible with your neighbors when they're entertaining. If there is a situation where loud people or music is creating a real nuisance, try phoning and asking your neighbors to keep the noise down. Many times people don't realize how well and how far loud noise, especially music, carries.
- If you can't resolve the situation, HPD does have a number to report loud music and party noise. According to Officer Pate, dial 713-884-3131, a recording will start, press 1 and you'll be directed to a call taker.

And, of course, always call 911 if you hear noise that may be coming from an assault, domestic violence or other criminal activity.

The Center for Hearing and Speech (CHS) is the only full-service resource in Houston, and one of only three in Texas, that teaches children with mild to profound hearing loss to speak and read rather than to use sign language. CHS has helped thousands of children develop listening, speaking and literacy skills needed to succeed in the mainstream hearing world. CHS depends on support from corporations, foundations, individuals and the United Way to achieve their goals.

The festival is FREE to viewers! Artists work feverishly over a two-day period to create their works, which are in turn voted on by the public, by dropping donations in the slotted tubs found at each station. Works of art range from pop culture to political messaging and even include a Kids Block where children can create their own masterpieces.

I have visited this event for the past three years. I continue to be amazed and entertained by the drawings. The festival is not overcrowded, and street parking is plentiful. The weather is almost always perfect. I leave the event feeling contentedly connected with my community and incredibly inspired by the artistic talent.
