Thanks to the support and participation from District C residents, Council Member Cohen's first two terms on Council proved to be both eventful and successful. This fruitful working relationship has resulted in over 15,000 constituent cases closed, helping to address neighborhood issues from water main leaks to potholes to missed trash pick-up.
