Join us for a conversation with Kenneth Olive, member of the Community Engagement Team for the Harris County Commissioner Rodney Ellis, Precinct One. There are four precincts in Harris County. Vermont Commons falls under Precinct One. The four elected commissioners, along with an elected county judge, serve as members of Harris County Commissioners Court, the administrative head of the county's government.

According to the government website, Precinct One's mission is to better the lives of its 1.1 million widely diverse residents by providing quality and accessible services and programs, and fighting for important reforms. Widening wealth gap is an increasing problem for the region, disproportionally affecting women and communities of color. Last January, Ellis proposed to create a Department of Economic Opportunity and Equity, which would implement economic policies focused on fair and equitable county contracting, workforce development, community business programs, community-based economic tax incentives, and workers' rights. Kenneth Olive will discuss this initiative which is designed to ensure long-term economic growth, as well address and mitigate economic inequality.





#### **CURBSIDE RECYCLING UPDATE**

Not everyone may be aware, that glass recently returned to the curbside recycling program, so residents may resume placing glass in their green bins. Because for the last three years the city's former recycling provider accepted only paper, cardboard, plastics and metal cans, glass containers had to be dropped off at the city's neighborhood depositories. Glass will now be processed using the most advanced technology available in the recycling industry at a newly-built plant through its contract with the new provider, FCC Environmental Services. The city also now pays much less for recycling, than it did before.
